On more than one occasion, Kylie has helped our unit accomplish tasks that lead to positive patient outcomes and satisfaction.


Kylie is a reliable source when it comes to protocols and resources. For example, Kylie is knowledgeable when preparing charts for patient procedures and even flight transfer packets.

I think it's important that we give recognition to the demonstration of the "First 5 minutes of a CODE BLUE," which led to optimal patient outcomes for the Progressive Care Unit team that participated in a CODE BLUE. I'm unsure who was directly involved, but I know the CC was Aloha, and the Primary RN was Jerick. I know our hospital has been conducting "The first 5-minute mock drills, and this is something we have been working on as there is a push for ACLS certification for all units. This was a good demonstration of positive change in action.

The patient was witnessed to have sustained VTACH on Telemetry. The primary nurse assessed the patient to be unresponsive and pulseless. CPR was initiated immediately. The patient was placed then placed on Zoll monitoring, and following ACLS protocols, one defibrillation was administered to the patient with immediate return of ROSC. All prior to the ICU/CB team arriving at the unit.

The Primary RN then relayed this information to the CB team, who resumed over medications and Zoll for stabilization and transfer to the ICU.

The PCU team demonstrated exemplary care of a patient in a CODE BLUE situation, with clear roles, clear closed-loop communication, and quick and decisive action, which I believe led to positive outcomes.

If you could forward my thanks and acknowledgment to Aloha to let her team know, that would be much appreciated.





Exceptional and came!

I stayed at Hilo Medical Center from February 5-7, 2024. I was brought into Emergency by ambulance following a STEMI. I was very fortunate to have Dr. Andrew Murray DO and the Cardiac Cath Team waiting for me when I arrived.

I want to express my sincerest and deepest gratitude to Dr. Murray and the entire Cardiac Cath Team for the exceptional care I received and for saving my life.

I was transferred to ICU following my procedure. Curtis, RN got me settled in; making sure I had everything I needed and answered all my questions. John, RN took over on the next shift. He continued the same high level of care and comfort. Finally, Natalia, RN came on the following shift. She made me laugh and was my Patient Advocate, while always providing exceptional care. Amanda, RN, also came in to check on me and to make sure that I was feeling good about my care.

Having a heart attack, a cardiac catheterization and being in ICU can be very scary. These three RNs made me feel comfortable, and confident that I was receiving the best care possible.

Dr. Murray followed me during my stay in ICU. He showed me what happened to my heart and some of the concerns with the valves in my heart by using a heart model. I really appreciated the detailed explanation. He was never rushed and always allowed time to answer my questions. Dr. Sawyer also came in to give me some pertinent updates on my condition. I was so impressed by the way he conveyed the information in a relaxed and easy-to-understand manner.

Unfortunately, I had to stay an extra night and I was a little anxious when I was moved to PCU because I had become so comfortable with my care in ICU.

I was transferred to PCU at change of shift. Kirsten was the first RN to care for me. I soon realized I was in great hands. She was very attentive, friendly, and helpful. I was impressed with the PCU staff because everyone seemed to work so well together. They were very supportive and appreciative of each other. Star, RN was the last nurse to care for me and she was also exceptional. Star gave me my discharge instructions. I was anxious to get home but she sat down and made sure we didn't rush through any of the information that I needed to know. She then walked me downstairs and waited with me until my husband drove up with our car.

I am writing this letter because I am truly grateful to every person who cared for me during my stay at Hilo Medical Center. I wish to express my gratitude to all those I have mentioned but also to so many people for whom I don't have a name.
